Eagles Cup Lightning Carnival

The Eagles Cup Lightning Carnival will be held in Week 8, on Friday 7th June. We have three sports including, AFL, Soccer and Netball.

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Curriculum

Writing

Bateman delivers a whole-school approach to writing using Talk for Writing. The writing produced in Term 1 was outstanding and gives us a great baseline to set goals for student growth throughout the year. Term 2 will see us complete 1 x 3-week block of Information Reports, 1 x 2 week block of Procedure Writing, 1 x 3 week block of Poetry and finishing off with Newspaper Reports.

Reading

This term will see us moving away from the whole-class novel study and moving directly into Reading sessions based on reading ability. Our reading comprehension will be integrated with our Talk for Writing program as well as reading sessions. Students will continue to work on explicit reading comprehension strategies and then apply these to a wider range of texts, both written and still image. Each class will rotate focusing on strategies over a two week period and learn apply these skills further.

Spelling

We will be continuing on with Bateman Primary's own spelling program for 2024. We will be using an evidence-based approach combining Heggerty Phonological Awareness program for those students that require this, as well as Etymolgy, Root Words and Investigations.

Maths

For Term 2, we will continue with Math groups. In Number and Algebra, we will be focusing on addition and subtraction of fractions. In Measurement and Geometry, we will be focusing on perimeter, length & area, volume, capacity and mass, tessellation & symmetry and time.

Health

Term 2 will see us finishing off our whole-school URStrong program and completing our Sole Projects. We will also look at Brain Development and Choices.

HASS

In Term 2, we will finish off Migration before moving into Civics & Citizenship and Geography. HASS will be delivered through a combination of explicit teaching and project-based learning.

Digital Technologies

Digital Technologies will be completed as a Year 6 group. We will finish Digital Citizenship learning, before moving onto Robotics and Coding.

Visual Art

Visual Art will be delivered to students as a whole Year 6 group and then completed in classrooms. All Year 6 students will complete the same project.

Kitchen Garden

This term Students will complete 4 x 120 min Kitchen Garden sessions per term with Jane O'Dwyer.
